## Scotland Island 1810 - 2010

**Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> September 2010**

**11.15am – 2.15pm**

**Event Details:** Bring your picnic lunch and meet us at Church Point Ferry Wharf for a trip to Catherine Park, Scotland Island where local historians will speak about the history of the island. Visit the Bushfire Brigade garden to see the monument erected by the Manly Warringah & Pittwater Historical Society in 1960 to commemorate the sesquicentenary of the granting of Scotland Island to Andrew Thompson. Then, if you wish, take a stroll to the place where Thompson set up his salt works in 1806.

The ferry ride from Church Point passes around the eastern side of Scotland Island to Tennis Court Wharf where we will disembark for the picnic spot. On the return journey the ferry runs along Pittwater's lower western foreshores and into Lovett Bay and Elvina Bay before arriving back at Church Point.

**Cost:** This is a free event but each participant will be required to pay his or her return ferry fare, currently \$12.50 (adult) or \$6.80 (concession and children aged 5 to 16). Donations to the Society welcome.
